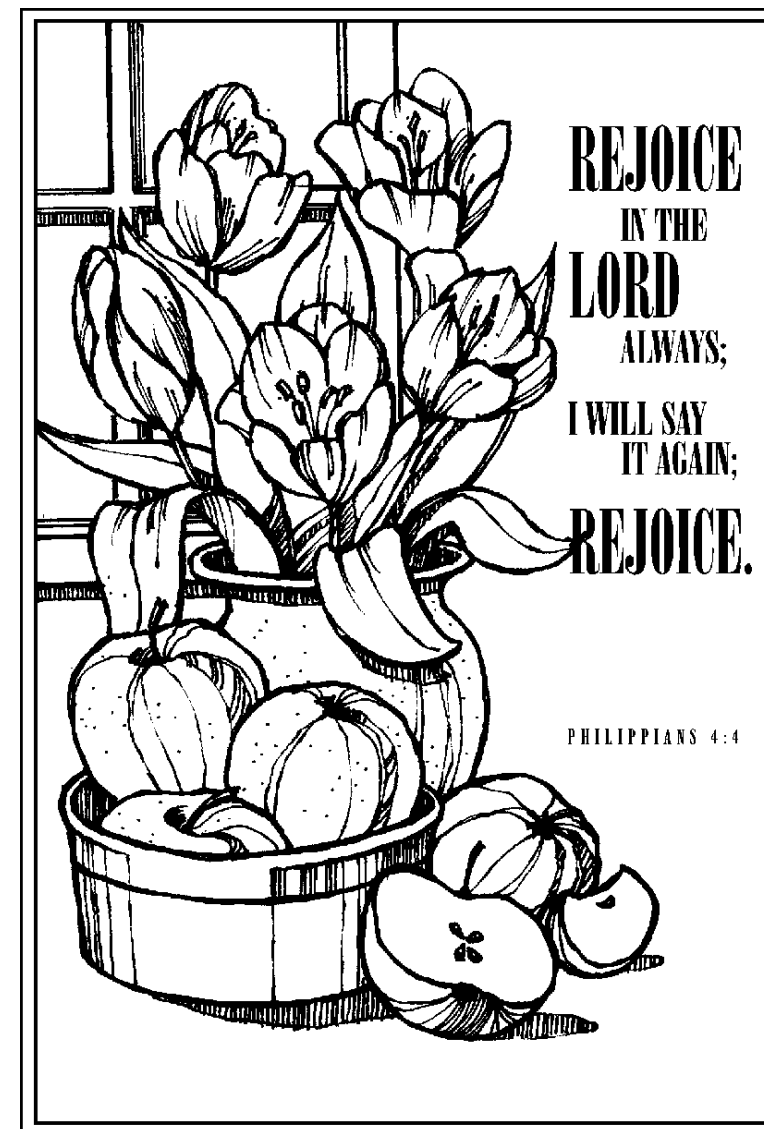

A memorial donation was given in memory of Agnes "Pearl" Shuler by her family.



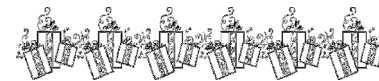

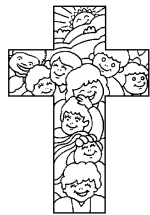
